Laredo College offers two levels of study: a two-year Associate of Applied Science degree (D) in Child Development and a one-year Child Development Assistant Certificate (C1).

The Child Development curriculum is designed to train people as assistants, teachers, or directors in early childhood programs. Committed to the idea that quality care makes a positive difference in the lives of children and their families, the program responds to the demand for quality child care staff. The program addresses student competencies and standards for early childhood programs, as developed by the National Association for the Education of Young Children, State Board for Educator's Certification Pedagogy and Professional Responsibilities Standards, and the Child Development National Credential Program. Students must maintain a "C" or better in all Child Development courses in order to get credit for the course and proceed to the next course as stated in the certificate and AAS degree plans.

Instruction is centered on lecture, lab, internships, and field experience classes which offer direct participation in a variety of settings, including child care centers, preschools, nursery schools, early childhood programs, and public schools.

Child Care Teacher: Education and training requirements vary based on settings and state regulations. Preschool teachers typically need at least an associate's degree. **Pay** The median annual wage for preschool teachers was \$31,930.00, \$15.35 per hour, in 2020. **Job Outlook** Employment of preschool teachers is projected to grow 7 percent from 2018 to 2028, faster than the average for all occupations. Growth is expected due to a continued focus on the importance of early childhood education.
