# Certification and Licensure Information

Graduates of the program will be eligible to take the State Board Written and Practical Examination for Texas Cosmetology Operator License administered by the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation (TDLR). After successful completion of these examinations, the graduate will be a Licensee Cosmetology Operator. In addition, the states of Texas require licensure to practice; however, state licenses are usually based on the results of the TDLR Examination. Every individual who applies for a license with the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation ("the Department") is subject to a criminal background check to determine the student suitability for the license. ### **Career Information**

Upon passing the State Board Licensure Examination a Texas Cosmetology Operator can work in a variety of settings, including beauty salons, spas, nail salon, retailers, schools, work for a corporation, rent a stylist booth, and/or open their own business.

Under the Texas Cosmetology Law Occupations Code Chapter 1602.002 Texas Cosmetology Operators can perform the following services: Haircutting, Hairstyling, Haircolor, Makeup application, Facial treatment, Nail Enhancement Application, Manicures, Pedicures, Hair Removal, and Eyelash application.

Cosmetology Operator, Haircolor Specialist, Texture Specialist, Haircutting Specialist, Salon Trainer, Salon Manager, Salon Assistant Manager, Distributor Sales Consultant, Manufacturer Educator, Cosmetology Instructor, Makeup Artist, Stylist, and Salon Owner etc.
