The Associates of Science (AS) General Studies degree in Criminal Justice field of study is designed to satisfy the attainment of a board, balanced, two – year college education. This degree forms the foundation and prerequisites for transferring into a baccalaureate program. Students must complete a minimum of 60 semester credit hours to earn an AS; 42 semester credit hours are core curriculum requirements.
