The AAS degree in Applied Accounting is designed to prepare students for various career opportunities in accounting such as bookkeepers or junior accountants. Emphasis is placed on internal accounting principles and procedures as they related to external reporting. This program is intended to provide a foundation on which the graduate can build an accounting career through expanded experiences and/or further education. Courses that complete the Degree (D) and courses that complete the Certificate II (C II) or One Semester Certificate (C I) are noted below.
