Transfer Information

The Associate of Applied Science in Homeland Security Studies prepares students to directly enter the workforce; however, a Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences (BAAS) or Bachelor of Science (BS) is an excellent alternative to complete (or exceed minimal standards of) the educational requirement for some positions within the Department of Homeland Security. You still must meet general education requirements and take upper-level courses.

Transfer Guides: The evaluation of transfer courses and the determination of which courses will apply toward a bachelor's degree are conducted by the receiving institution. At present, the Homeland Security Studies Program is not recognized for transfer credit by colleges or universities, as no formal articulation agreements have been established. Securing such agreements and expanding transfer opportunities will be a priority as the program continues to grow and evolve.
