

Laredo College's Associate Degree Nursing Transition Program offers LVNs and Paramedics with an AAS degree a streamlined path to becoming Registered Nurses. Completed in just three semesters, the program builds on prior healthcare experience and prepares students for entry-level nursing roles in diverse settings such as acute, long-term, and primary care.

Upon completion of the Associate Nursing Program, the student may register for the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX-RN) to become a Registered Nurse. The same exam is administered for the A.D.N. and B.S.N. traditional nursing programs nationwide. Regional Labor Market Information

As of May 2024, the average annual salary for registered nurses in Texas is \$90,010, while the national average stands at \$93,600, equivalent to an hourly wage of \$45.00. These figures are based on estimates from the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS)

Occupational Outlook Handbook. Employment of registered nurses is projected to grow by 6 percent from 2023 to 2033, which is faster than the average growth rate for all occupations.

The Organization for Associate Degree Nursing (OADN) promotes the advancement of ADN graduates through the promotion of best practices in nursing education and academic progression. OADN, along with the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation (RWJF), supported the National Education in Progression in Nursing (NEPIN) Collaborative with a goal of 90% of new ADN graduates achieving the BSN or higher by 2025 (OADN, 2020).
