Certification Information

Graduates of the AEMT program are eligible to obtain a National and State AEMT certification.

The National EMT Certification is given by the National Registry of EMTs (NREMT). Graduates will have to log in to their NREMT account to submit their application to sign up for the certification exam and pay the exam fee. The Pearson Vue testing administers the certification exam. It's the graduates responsibility to renew their certification every two years with continuing education hours. The State AEMT Certification is given by the Texas Department of State Health Services (TX DSHS). Once graduates obtain their NREMT AEMT certification they can apply for the State AEMT certification. Graduates will have to log in to their TX DSHS account and submit an application and pay the required fee on the TX DSHS website. Once graduates obtain their State AEMT certification it is their responsibility to renew their certification every four years with continuing education hours.

New workers generally start around \$17 an hour. Normal pay for AEMTs is \$36,000 per year, while highly experienced workers can earn as much as \$38,000 per year in this region. Over the last year, 6 companies have posted job openings for Paramedics in the Laredo area.
