Laredo College offers two levels of study: a two-year Associate of Applied Science degree (D) in Child Development and a one-year Child Development Assistant Certificate (C1).

The Child Development curriculum is designed to train people as assistants, teachers, or directors in early childhood programs. Committed to the idea that quality care makes a positive difference in the lives of children and their families, the program responds to the demand for quality child care staff. The program addresses student competencies and standards for early childhood programs, as developed by the National Association for the Education of Young Children, State Board of Educator's Certification Pedagogy and Professional Responsibilities Standards, and the Child Development National Credential Program. Students must maintain a "C" or better in all Child Development courses in order to get credit for the course and proceed to the next course as stated in the certificate and AAS degree plans.

Instruction is centered on lecture, lab, internships, and field experience classes which offer direct participation in a variety of settings, including child care centers, preschools, nursery schools, early childhood programs, and public schools.

The Associate of Applied Science in Child Development prepares students to directly enter the workforce; however, a Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences (BAAS) is an excellent alternative to the Bachelor's degree. The Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences degree applies non-transferable courses and work experience towards the Bachelor's degree. You still must meet general education requirements and take upper level courses.
