

2014 Property Tax Rates in LAREDO COMMUNITY COLLEGE

This notice concerns the 2014 property tax rates for LAREDO COMMUNITY COLLEGE. It presents information about three tax rates. Last year's tax rate is the actual tax rate the taxing unit used to determine property taxes last year. This year's *effective* tax rate would impose the same total taxes as last year if you compare properties taxed in both years. This year's *rollback* tax rate is the highest tax rate the taxing unit can set before taxpayers start rollback procedures. In each case these rates are found by dividing the total amount of taxes by the tax base (the total value of taxable property) with adjustments as required by state law. The rates are given per \$100 of property value.

Statement of Increase/Decrease

If LAREDO COMMUNITY COLLEGE adopts a 2014 tax rate equal to the effective tax rate of \$0.248813 per \$100 of value, taxes would increase compared to 2013 taxes by \$416,356.
