STATEMENT OF ITEM SPECIFICATIONS

The purpose and intent of this Request for Proposal is to purchase a **New Type III Ambulance and Stretcher**.

Quantity: (1) New 2026 Type III Ambulance and Stretcher with the following specifications:

1. Purpose

Laredo College EMS Program is seeking proposals for the purchase of one (1) new, turnkey Type III ambulance to be used for EMS education and training. The unit must be fully equipped, compliant, and ready for service upon delivery.

2. General Requirements

- Unit must be new (unused) and in current production model year (2025 or newer preferred)
- Must be a Type III ambulance (van chassis with integrated modular patient compartment)
- Must be delivered as a complete, turnkey unit under a single invoice
- Total cost must not exceed \$232,000 (including all equipment, delivery, and fees)
- Unit must be delivered and operational no later than July 31, 2026

3. Chassis Requirements

- Ford E-350, E-450, or equivalent cutaway chassis
- Gasoline engine (minimum 7.3L V8 or equivalent)
- Automatic transmission
- Dual rear wheels
- OEM safety systems and backup camera
- Gross Vehicle Weight Rating (GVWR) appropriate for ambulance operations

4. Patient Compartment (Module)

- Fully enclosed modular ambulance body
- Minimum interior headroom: ~68 inches
- Pass-through access between cab and patient compartment
- Full ALS cabinet configuration with secure storage
- Squad bench with integrated seatbelts for patient transport/training
- Technician (captain's) chair with safety restraints
- Non-slip, medical-grade flooring
- Interior LED lighting with high/low intensity modes
- Action area with integrated controls and outlets

5. Electrical & Power Systems

- Shoreline power inlet (minimum 110–125 VAC)
- Integrated inverter/charger system
- 12V DC and 110V AC outlets in patient compartment
- Battery system sufficient for EMS operations
- Interior and exterior scene lighting (LED preferred)

6. HVAC System

- Dedicated patient compartment HVAC system
- Must meet KKK-A-1822 and/or NFPA standards
- Capable of maintaining interior temperature in high ambient heat environments

7. Patient Handling Equipment (Required – Turnkey Inclusion)

- Power stretcher system (e.g., Stryker Power-Pro 2, Ferno X2, or equivalent)
- Power loading/retention system (e.g., Stryker Power-LOAD, Ferno F2, or equivalent)
- Fully installed and compliant mounting system (including floorplate and wiring)

8. Medical Equipment

- Portable suction unit (e.g., Laerdal LSU or equivalent) with mounting/charging capability
- Onboard oxygen system with regulator and outlets

9. Safety & Compliance

- Must meet or exceed current KKK-A-1822 and/or NFPA 1917 standards
- All seating positions must include appropriate restraint systems
- Emergency lighting and siren system compliant with state and federal regulations

10. Exterior Features

- Full emergency lighting package (LED)
- Rear and side scene lighting
- Reflective striping and rear chevron safety markings
- Custom graphics package included (agency name, striping, Star of Life, etc.)

11. Warranty

- Manufacturer warranty on chassis and module preferred
- Vendors must clearly specify warranty coverage for:
 - Chassis
 - Ambulance module
 - Installed equipment

12. Delivery Requirements

- Unit must be delivered to:
 - Laredo College – EMS Program
 - 5500 South Zapata Highway
 - Laredo, TX 78046
- Delivery must occur on or before July 31, 2026
- Vendor must provide estimated delivery timeline and notify of any delays

13. Proposal Requirements

Vendors must include:

- Detailed specifications of proposed unit
- Itemized pricing (including all equipment and fees)
- Confirmation of compliance with all requirements
- Estimated delivery timeline
- Warranty details
- Photos or examples of similar units (if available)

14. Evaluation Criteria

Proposals will be evaluated based on:

- Compliance with specifications
- Ability to meet delivery timeline
- Total cost (must not exceed \$232,000)
- Equipment completeness (turnkey readiness)
- Vendor reliability and support

15. Additional Notes

- Laredo College reserves the right to accept or reject any proposal
- “Or equivalent” substitutions must meet or exceed listed specifications
- Preference may be given to vendors who can deliver in-stock or near-complete units within the required timeframe

BRAND NAME OR SUBSTANTIALLY EQUAL PRODUCT

1. This request for proposal (RFP) is **not restricted** to any brand as long it meets the specifications listed above.
2. Failure to comply with the above requirements may result in rejection of the Proposal.

EVALUATION OF PROPOSAL

GENERAL

To facilitate the evaluation process, proposals must be submitted as requested by the **District** in the **Section "Submission of Proposals,"** This will ensure uniformity of all proposals. Proposals may be rejected if they show omissions, alterations in wording, conditional clauses, or irregularities of any kind. The **District** is the final authority that determines if the proposal is in compliance with the RFP, including the specifications, terms, and conditions. The **Vendor** may submit a proposal for a “Substantially Equal” product. The product specifications, schematics, and pictures should be included for products of similar or substantially equal quality.

INDEMNIFICATION

The **Vendor** shall indemnify and hold harmless the **District**, its Trustees, Agents and Employees, from and against any and all claims, demands, and actions or causes of action of any nature whatsoever arising out of or by reason of the execution or performance of the duties and obligations of the **Vendor** under the terms of the contract. The **District** shall notify the Vendor promptly in writing of any claim or action. An indemnification agreement acceptable to the **District** shall be included in the contract.

VENUE

It is understood and agreed by both the **Vendor** and the **District** that venue for any litigation involving the contract shall lie in Webb County, Texas.

TIE PROPOSALS

In the event of tie bids, one shall be selected by the casting of lots.

RIGHT TO REJECT PROPOSALS

The **District** reserves the right to reject any or all proposals, or any part thereof, and to waive any technicalities or informalities.

ALL OR NONE

This is an **all or none** Request for Proposal.
The College District will not award the contract to multiple vendors.

RIGHT TO HOLD PROPOSALS

The **District** reserves the right to hold proposals for sixty (60) calendar days before awarding the contract.

LATE PROPOSALS

All Proposals delivered shall be stamped with the time and date as proof they were received before the requested time and date. Proposals received after the requested time and date shall be considered late and returned unopened. If a return address is not provided, a late Proposal shall be opened only for identification purposes and then returned. If proposals are hand delivered any late proposals will be stamped disqualified. Mailed proposals will be stamped disqualified and will all be returned at the Vendor's expense.

SUBMISSION OF PROPOSALS

All proposals, whether delivered by hand or mail, are due in **individually sealed envelopes** endorsed with "RFP 26-0408 "LC EMS Ambulance and Stretcher" on Thursday, May 07, 2025 at 10:00 a.m. at the **District's** Purchasing Office, Building P-49.

Vendors must submit 1 **original seal** proposal labeled as **original** with 1 **electronic proposal** via USB drive of the following items to the College District. OPENING OF PROPOSALS

Proposals shall be publicly opened at 10:15 a.m. Thursday, May 07, 2026, at the Purchasing Office, Conference Room. It should be noted that only the names of the companies will be read publicly. Information regarding the offers will not be released until an award is made by the **District**.

RFP INTERPRETATION

No interpretation to the meaning of the "Request for Proposal" ("RFP") or other documents shall be given orally. Every request for interpretation will be in writing, addressed to the Director of Purchasing, and must be received at least ten (**10**) calendar days prior to the date fixed for the opening of the Proposal. Any and all such interpretations and supplemental instructions shall be in the form of written addenda to the "Request for Proposal," which if issued, shall be mailed to all known prospective **Vendor** no later than five (5) calendar days prior to the date fixed for the opening of the Proposal. Failure of any **Vendor** to receive any such addenda or interpretations shall not relieve such **Vendor** from any obligation under this bid as submitted. All addenda so issued shall become part of the contract document.

MODIFICATIONS OR WITHDRAWALS BEFORE RFP OPENING

Modifications or withdrawals of a Proposal shall be accepted only when the same is received on or before the fixed time scheduled for opening. Such requests must be executed in writing, or withdrawn in person by the **Vendor** or his authorized representative, provided identity is made known and a receipt for the proposal is signed.

MODIFICATIONS OR WITHDRAWALS BY SUCCESSFUL VENDOR

Modifications or withdrawal of a Proposal shall be accepted only from the successful **Vendor** if the change is executed in writing and is to the best interest of the **District** and not prejudicial to any other **Vendor**.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST

- A. Any Board member who has a substantial interest, either direct or indirect, in any business entity seeking to contract with the District shall, before any vote or decision on any matter involving the business entity, file an affidavit stating the nature and extend of interest and shall abstain from any participation in the matter.
- B. Vendors must convey any conflict of interest that may exist if selected to perform the Contract in accordance with the District’s Manual of Policy and applicable state and local laws.

AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS

All awards are subject to approval upon the availability of funds.

SALES TAX EXEMPTION

The College District hereby claims exemption from payment of taxes for the purchase of taxable goods and/or services under the Internal Revenue Code Section 501 (c) (3) and the Revised Civil Statutes of Texas, Chapter 20, Title 122A, as a Non-Profit Educational Institution.

SHIPPING MERCHANDISE

Merchandise must be shipped FOB Destination, such that, title of goods will not pass to the District’s receiving dock, and the price must include the freight charge if applicable.

DETERMINING AWARD

To determine to whom the contract will be awarded and to comply with Education Code 44.031, the **College District** shall consider:

1. The purchase price;
2. The reputation of the vendor and of the vendor’s goods or services;
3. The quality of the vendor’s goods or services.
4. The extent to which the goods or services meet the **District’s** needs;
5. The vendor’s past relationship with the **District**;
6. The impact on the ability of the **District** to comply with laws and rules relating to historically underutilized businesses;
7. The total long-term cost to the **District** to acquire the vendor’s goods or services;

8. Whether the vendor or vendor's ultimate parent company or majority owner: A) has its principal place of business in Texas; or B) employs at least 500 persons in Texas; and
9. Any other relevant factors specifically listed in this RFP.

The **District** is the final authority in determining if the proposal is in compliance with specifications.

The **District** reserves the right to interview finalists to clarify information provided in the proposals.

SELECTION OF PROPOSALS FOR REVIEW BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Following the evaluations, the committee may recommend one or two proposals to the Board of Trustees. The Board of Trustees will make a final selection based upon the evaluation committee's recommendation and such other factors as the Board deems to be in the **District's** best interest.

SELECTION OF VENDOR BY BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Once a final selection has been made, the **District** will submit a contract to the selected Vendor, which will include at least those terms set forth in this RFP. If the **District** and the selected Vendor have not executed an agreement within thirty (30) calendar days after the award, the **District** will negotiate with the **Vendor** submitting the following best proposal.

CONTRACT AWARD AND EXECUTION

The **District** reserves the right to execute an award without further discussion of the proposal submitted. The proposal should be initially submitted on the most favorable terms that can be offered. The Vendor shall specifically stipulate in the cover letter that the proposal is predicated upon the acceptance of all specifications, terms and conditions stated in this RFP. It is the intent of the District to award the contract within sixty calendar days from the date of the RFP opening.

HOUSE BILL 1295 – CERTIFICATE OF INTEREST PARTIES FORM 1295

Effective January 1, 2016 all contracts requiring an action or vote by the Laredo College Board of Trustees', regardless of the dollar amount, will require completion of Form 1295 "Certificate of Interested Parties," per the new Government Code Statute §2252.908. All vendors submitting a response to a formal Bid, RFP, SOQ or any contract(s), contract amendment(s), renewal(s) or change order(s) are required to complete the Form 1295 online through the State of Texas Ethics Commission website at the time the business entity Government Code §2252.908 (4d) submits the signed contract.

(2) the vendor:

- (i) a contract between the local governmental entity and vendor has been executed; or
