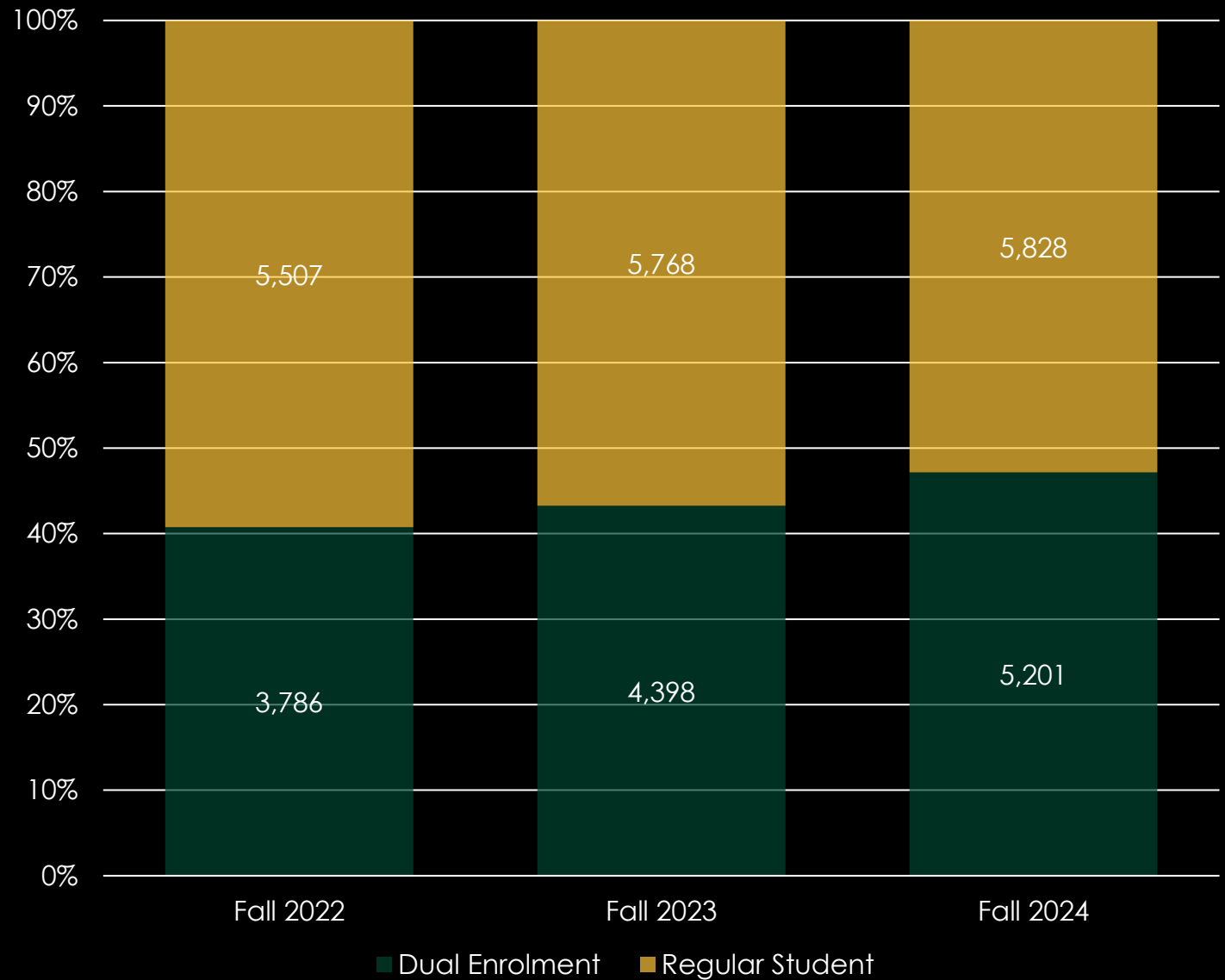

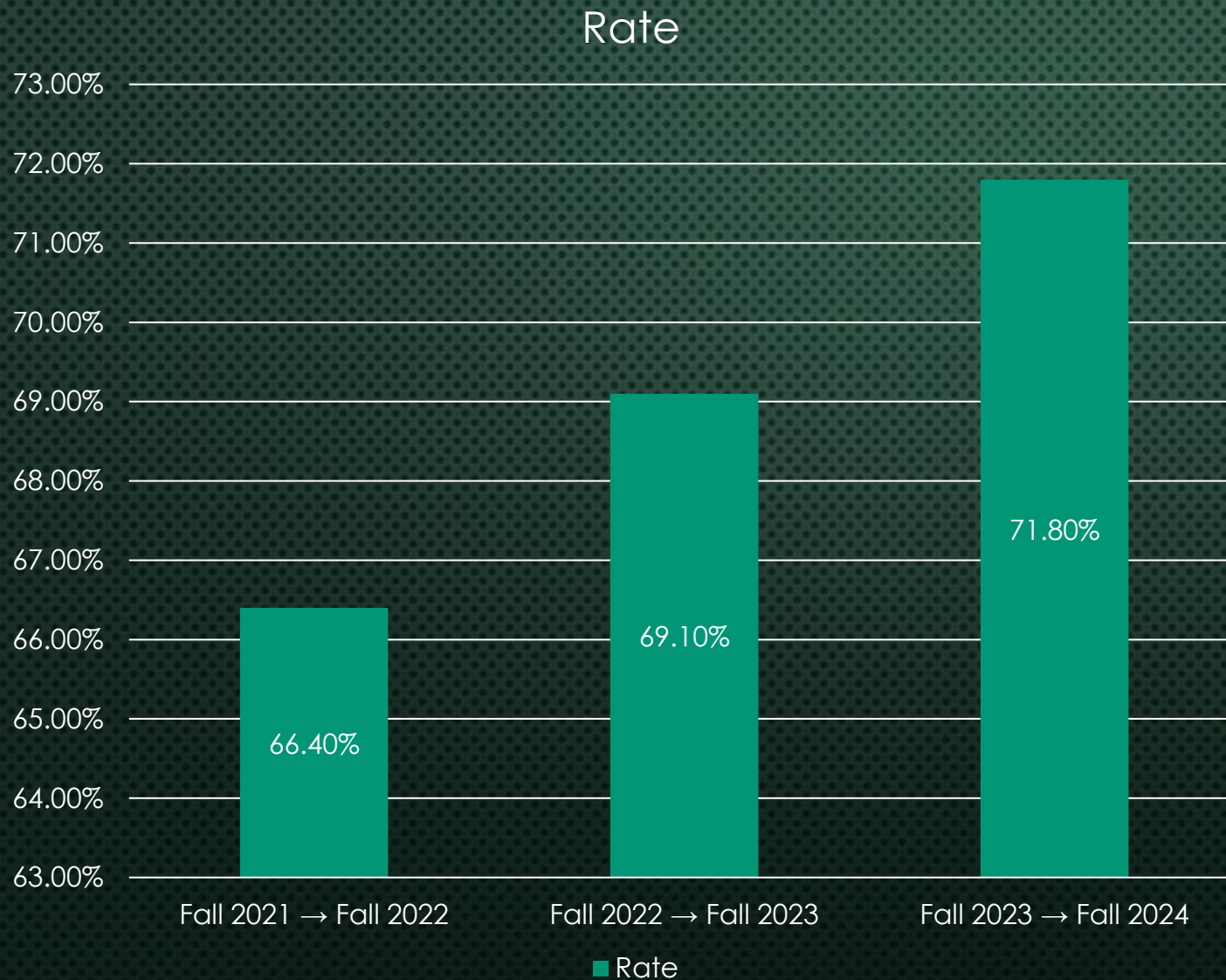

Total enrollment has increased steadily from 9,293 (Fall 2022) to 10,166 (Fall 2023) and reached a high of 11,029 (Fall 2024).



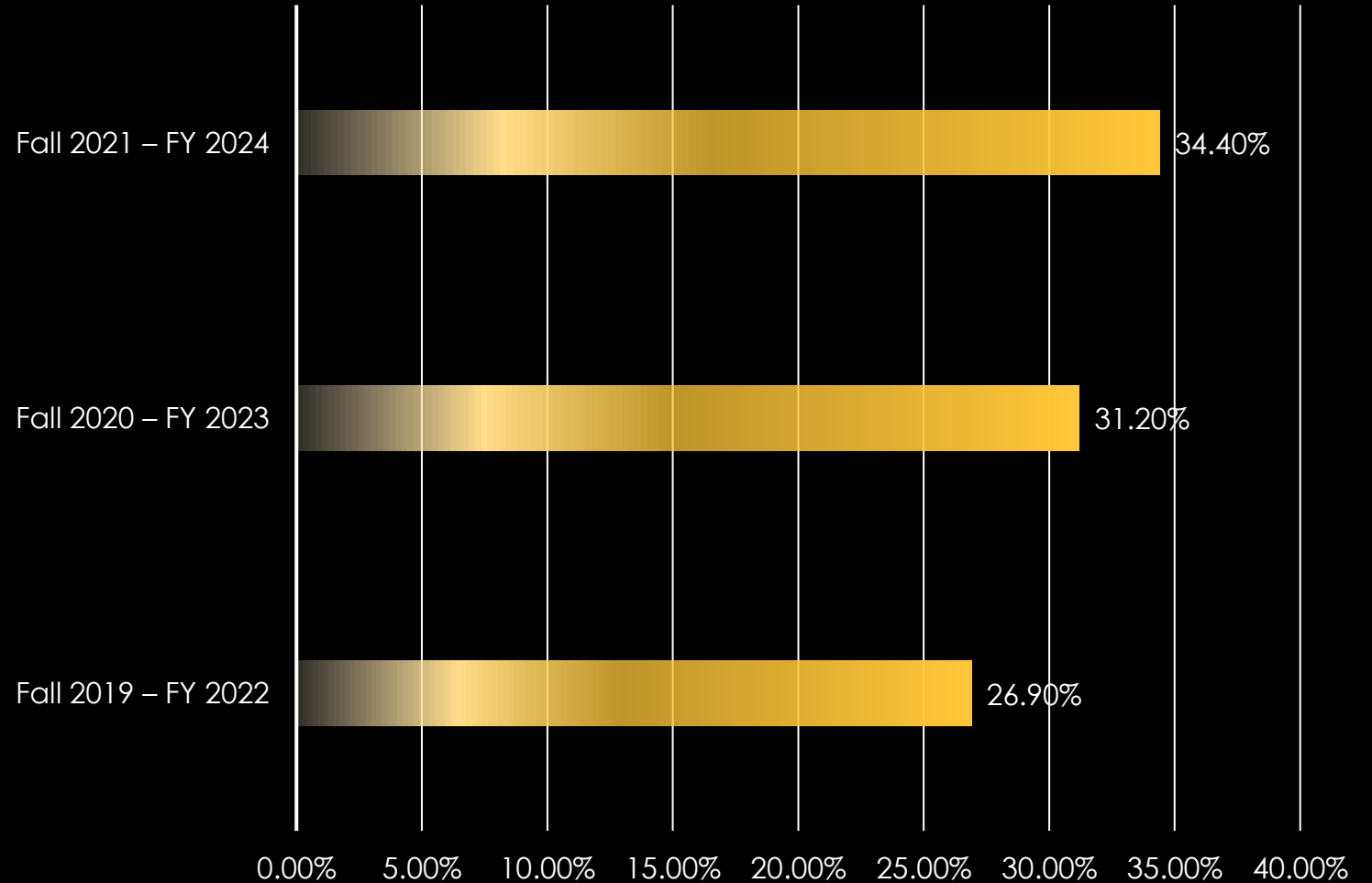


One-Year Persistence Rates

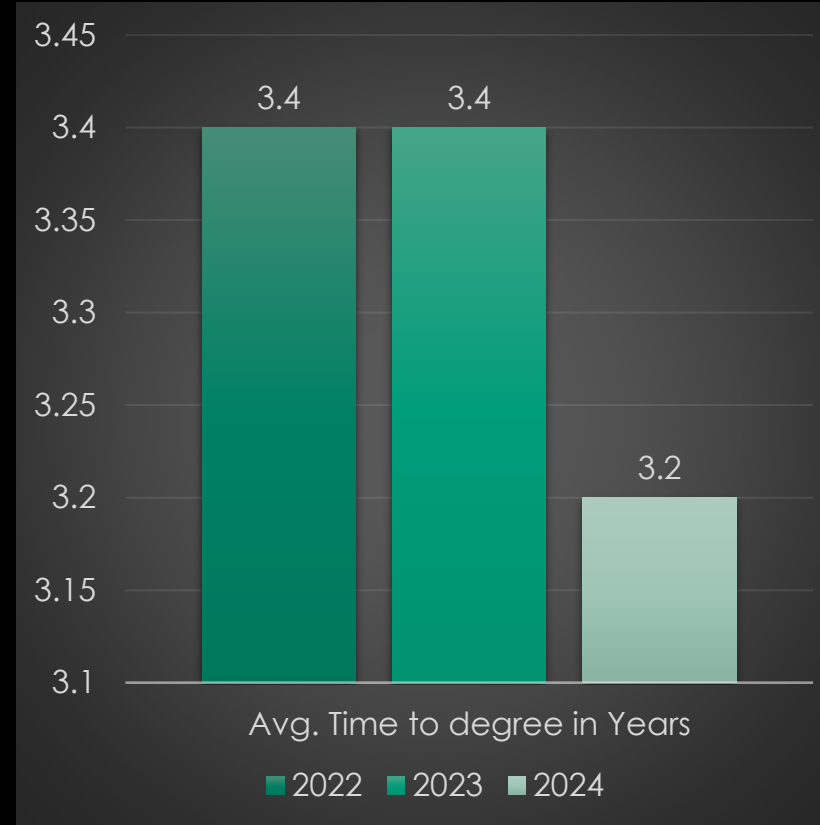
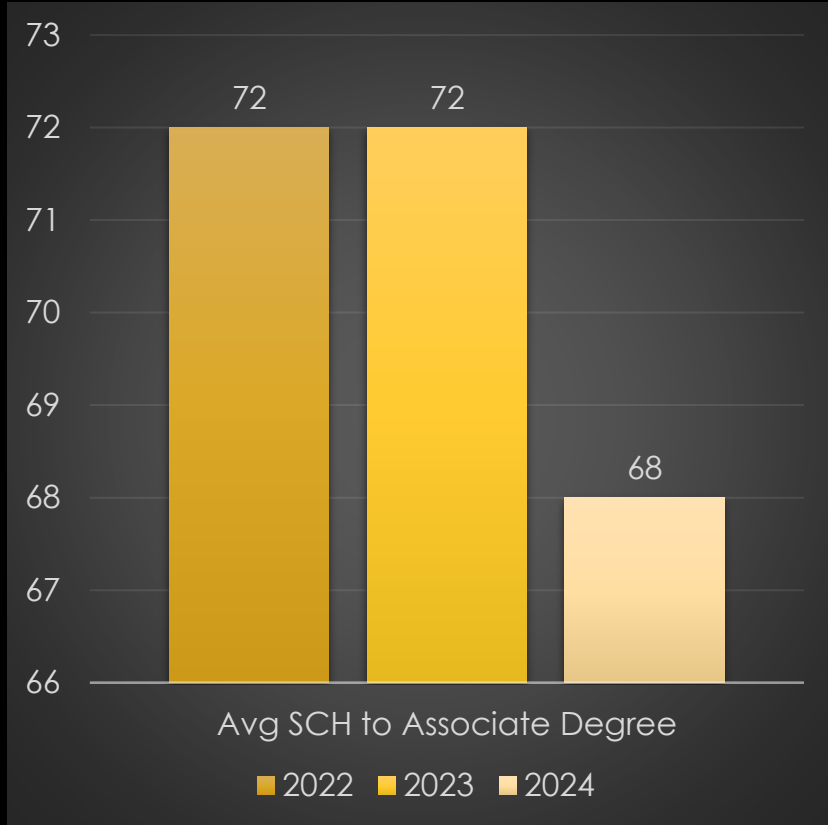
Persistence rates measure the percentage of students who continue their studies at the college from one academic year to the next. They reflect how well the institution supports students in staying enrolled and progressing toward completion.

Three-Year Graduation Rates

The three-year graduation rate shows the percentage of first-time, full-time students who complete a degree or certificate within 150% of the normal program length—typically three years for a two-year associate program.

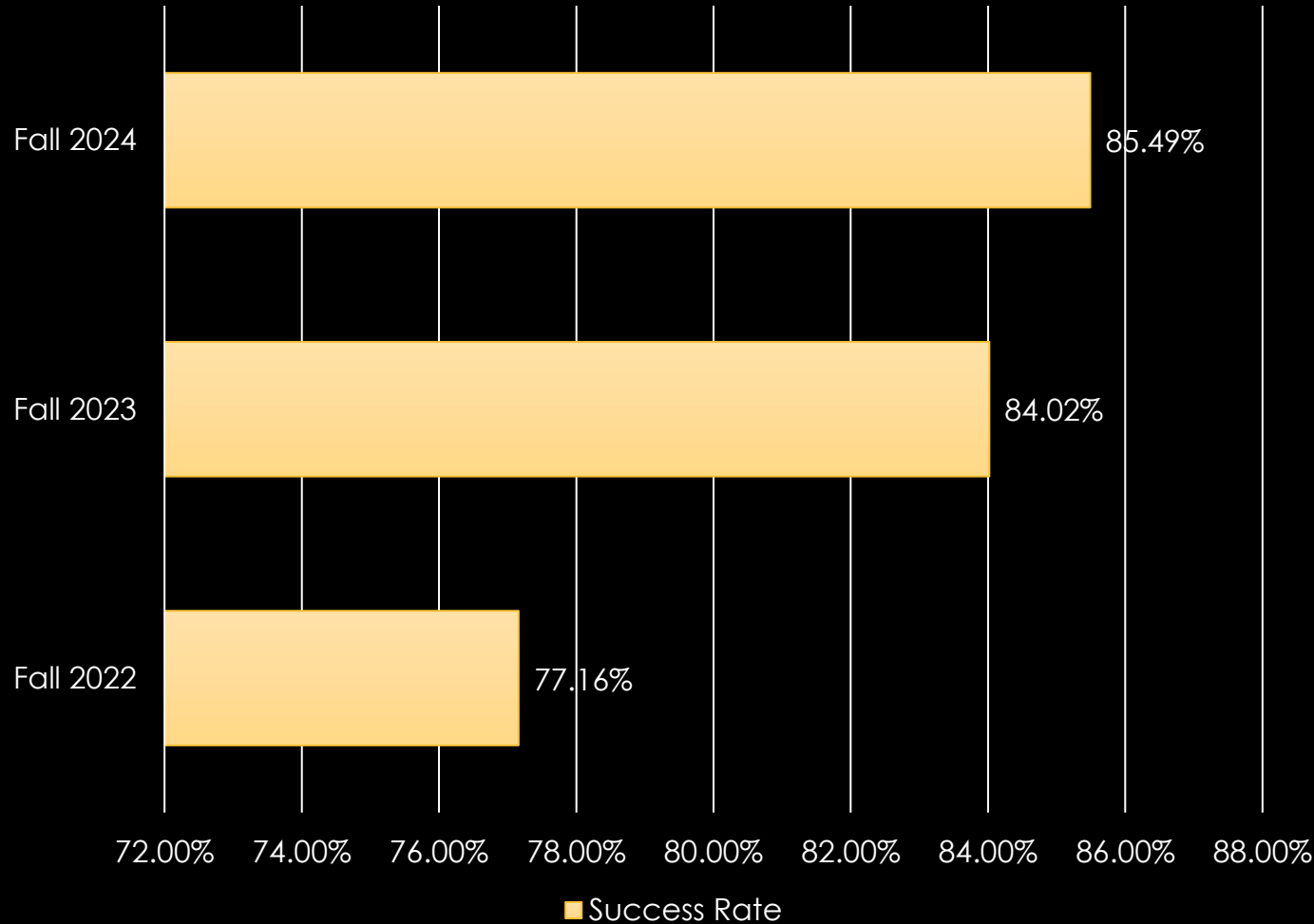


Degree Efficiency



Students are completing associate degrees with fewer semester credit hours (SCH) and in less time. From 2022 to 2024, the average SCH decreased from 72 to 68, and the average time to degree improved from 3.4 to 3.2 years, reflecting greater efficiency in student progression.

Student Success Rates



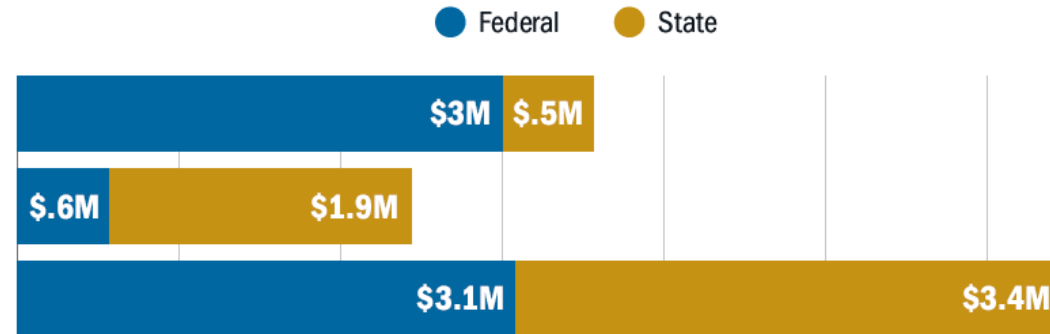
Student success rates measure the percentage of courses completed with a grade of A, B, or C, which are considered successful outcomes. A rising success rate indicates that more students are meeting course learning objectives and progressing toward program completion.

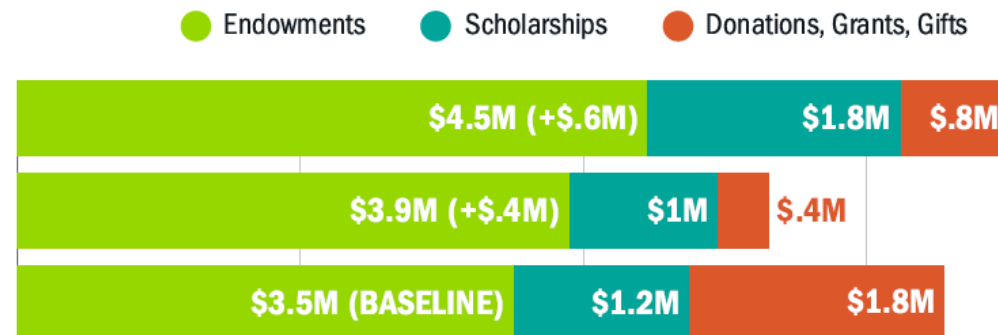

Quick Glossary of Terms

Credential of Value (COV) - Credentials of value that provide a positive return on investment within 10 years (on average), such that cumulative earnings will exceed students' initial investments.

Occupational Skills Award - A credit program of 9 to 14 SCH or a workforce continuing education program of 144 to 359 contact hours

Institutional Credentials Leading to Licensure or Certification (ICLC) - A credential awarded by an institution upon a student's completion of a course or series of courses that represent the achievement of identifiable skill proficiency and leading to licensure or certification.
